Letter from 2023 Co-Chairs

As we reflect on 2022 and 2023, two themes emerge: growth with challenges and thank you. Your support and partnership, as always, tops our list of items we are most grateful for. As we look back over the past two years, we could not have accomplished any of what we have without you, and that is HUGE!

2022 started off with receiving The Small Business of the Year award- a true testament to the commitment and compassion of our partnering agencies, our financial supporters, our volunteers, and our staff! WATEA is a critical driving force for good in our community! It hasn't always been easy. We've adjusted through our processes and made what seem to be mountainous decisions; the result of all that effort is undeniable.

Earlier this year our extremely competent and almost fearless executive director, Sara Guild, saw an opportunity at a partnering technical college and accepted a position there. The good news is, that partner (Mid-State Technical College) is still working with us in a shared grant delivery model for the Commute to Careers Program. WATEA was able to coordinate the logistics to accommodate both of us using her talents to maintain the delivery of the grant outcomes.

The full board, Jerry, Kent and Cory want to publicly thank Sara Guild for the almost four years of service and growth to our organization. Many of our policies and procedures are now better documented and organized thanks to Sara's energy and organizational skills; she led our organization with tremendous insight, excellent vision, and accomplished networking skills.

After an extensive search, we were able to find a talented replacement to take over the leadership position as our new executive director. We welcome Amy Yessa to that role. Amy is equally energetic and driven to help us succeed, and she comes from within our industry with experience that can't be easily taught; we are excited to have her taking the reins. Her first day began with a little over three weeks to coordinate the finishing touches on our annual golf fundraiser: with Sara's continued help, the help of countless hours of our volunteer board and many of you, and Amy's energy, we were able to pull off another annual fund-raising masterpiece. Our streak of having perfect weather for our event finally came to an end. We battled thru a power outage, and a hailstorm (both on the night of the set up) and then two different downpours of copious amounts of rainfall....but for some of us, that just let the adage of "fire at the flags" work a little better with the soft conditions. Amy and all our volunteers were amazing and as co-chairs we thank you.

As an organization, we also faced significant challenges to many of our initiatives to help with the recruitment pathways for our businesses. We were able to work together with NTC and the State of Wisconsin to launch a new Diesel Technician Registered Apprenticeship model. While trying to accomplish similar pathways and tracts for the Service Advisor, Auto Technician, and Collision Technician apprenticeship programs we ran a bit aground with the apprenticeship board. We as an organization were unable to develop or coordinate a pathway that seemed to mesh at this time. But we still hope to revisit that at some point in the future. We were able to accomplish continuing our Collision Technician program, which has now successfully graduated and increased our worker pool of talent by over thirty-five students. We continue to develop and improve the offerings of this program with the intention of eventually having one of the technical colleges in our area take this program up to full academic and program development. NTC and Wausau School District have been very positive in their support for that through these initial cohorts.

Our initiatives in attending and supporting career education events have remained steadfast and our NASCAR Pit Stop simulator has been a big hit at these events. We hosted another spectacularly attended student engagement Career Night at one of our local dealer partners with rave reviews. We continue to manage and provide assistance with our other community organizations to provide real impact relief in our Wheels to Work and Commute To Careers programs. Despite the hurdles that are often faced by community driven and supported programs, we are confident that they are making a positive impact on the lives of the individuals and families they are designed to help.

The question is where do we go from here?

We see glimpses of the future all around us. We see it in the steady interest in transportation related careers. We see it in the continual ringing of the phone with Wheels To Work inquiries. We see it in the strengthening of relationships with so many community partners and members!

Whether it be through volunteer time at our annual golf outing fundraiser, the annual transportation career expo, or various other events we participate in, we need each and every one of you that is reading this! Let's ALL think big, **ACT**, and make 2024 the biggest and best year yet!

- DCE Middle School: All students explore the transportation/distribution/logistics pathway by designing, building and racing a CO2 dragster

The DCE Auto Tech lab can easily house six cars and a semi at one time and is outfitted with multiple tire changers, an alignment machine, a hydraulic tube bender for custom exhaust repairs and diesel repair equipment.



EXTENSIVE OPPORTUNITIES

Students in grades 6 - 12 are provided hands-on learning opportunities in the classroom that build awareness of TDL pathways. Grade 6-9 students also can tour the Auto Tech labs and visit with current DCE Senior High students.

- During the 2022-23 School Year, 7 students participated in the Youth.
 Apprenticeship program in the TDL Pathway
- **ONE** DCE 2023 graduate earned the WATEA-sponsored Automotive Collision Certificate.

2022-2023 HIGHLIGHTS

Transportation Programs

- Automotive program is Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) certified, and graduates get credit towards their ASE work experience - Reaccreditation Fall 2023.
- Diesel program ASE initial accreditation Fall 2023.
- Signed training agreement with Peterbilt Motor Company - Dealer Sponsored Vocational Programs.

Mid-State Technical College Shuttle Service in Partnership with Commute2Careers

- 100 students have received at least 1 shuttle ride since the program started on August 21, 2022.
- 30 students have been frequent shuttle users, meaning they used it at least once per week for half a semester or more.

Fall 2023 Semester

- Shuttles are averaging 10 riders/19 trips per day and 18 riders/70 trips per week.
- Total one-way trips = 1,128 (including field trips).
- Vans are driving an average of 2,975 miles/week.
- In addition to the 4 main campuses, students have been transported to/from stops in Big Flats, Nekoosa, Auburndale, the UW-Stevens Point university housing, the Healthcare Simulation Center (Aspirus Riverview), Marshfield Clinic, and a culinary class field trip.

AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY

- 18 first semester students, 5 third semester students, and 7 flex students currently enrolled.
- Full program review and refresh ongoing as part of our Transportation 4.0 initiative.
- Continuing to explore Apprenticeship possibilities with industry feedback and support.

AUTO-COLLISION FUNDAMENTALS

- Flexible, part-time schedule. We are currently planning for another cohort of 10 students starting this Fall.
- Now entering our third cohort of the program with 35 successful students over the last 2 years.
- Run in partnership with WATEA, and Industry & K-12 partners.

DIESEL TECHNOLOGY

- 21 First Semester students enrolled.
- Creating a Certified Pre-Apprenticeship (CPA) for 5 Dual-Credit classes taken by high school students (the CPA to allow high-schools to qualify for CTE grant funding for students successfully completing it, providing additional High School funding).
- Diesel Apprenticeship program running and is first of its kind nationally.

- 106 Class A students and 10 Class B students completed over the last year.
- New accelerated Class B program Now completed in 3 weeks.

- Driver refresh and Hazmat courses available, and School Bus Driver Training in development.
